**CAFOD** are launching an <u>emergency appeal</u> for donations to get aid to the people of Sudan as soon as possible. When violence broke out last year in Sudan, most aid agencies evacuated & humanitarian workers are struggling to get aid to the people. The situation has gone from serious to desperate very quickly. The UN is calling it 'the world's worst displacement crisis'. **This weekend** there will be a collection for the people of Sudan.
